The Social Security Administration and/or Department of Homeland Security are unable to confirm your U.S. Citizenship or eligible Non-Citizen status. **(Students will provide original documents to financial aid staff and the financial aid staff will make copies of the documents as per Federal Register 668.16(f)(3).)**

1. Check your 2016-17 student aid report (SAR) to make sure the following information is correct. Make corrections on your SAR electronically at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
  - a. Questions 1-3 – Last name, first name, and middle initial is as listed on the social security card.
  - b. Question 8 – Your social security number is reported correctly on your SAR.
  - c. Question 9 – Your birthdate is reported correctly on your SAR.
  - d. Questions 14-15 – Your citizenship status is correctly listed. If you are an eligible non-citizen, make sure your Alien Registration number is correct on the SAR.

Make corrections on your SAR electronically. Go to item 2 if the problem is not resolved.

2. Complete the section below and return to the Office of Student Financial Planning with proof of your U.S. citizenship or eligible non-citizen documentation. Check the item listed below that refers to your status and provide required documentation.
  - If you are a U.S. Citizen, provide the following non-expired documents.
    - a. Birth certificate showing you were born in the U.S. and a copy of your social security card
    - b. Document indicating birth abroad of a U.S. citizen: FS-240, FS-545, or DS-1350
    - c. U.S. passport indicating U.S. citizenship
    - d. Certificate of citizenship from USCIS: N-560 or N-561
    - e. Certificate of Naturalization from USCIS: N-550 or N-570
  - If you are an eligible non-citizen, provide the following non-expired documents.
    - a. Alien Registration Receipt Card: I-551 card
    - b. Arrival-Departure Record from USCIS showing any of the following: refugee, asylum granted, indefinite parole and/or Humanitarian Parole, or Cuban-Haitian Entrant: I-94 Document

If you were not born in the United States, a Document Verification Request (G-845) will be submitted to verify U.S. citizenship and immigration service. Federal and state funding will not be available until an approved response has been received.
